Campus Public Safety Committee (CPSC) - June 3, 2016

Convened: 2:05 pm

Topic: Welcome and Introductions

Topic: Review of meeting notes from 5/13 meeting.

Action: Approved without revision. Meeting notes are now ready to post to website.

Topic: Chief Zerzan's report

Discussion: CPSO is preparing its final report to the Board of Trustees for the 2015-16 academic year. The CPSC is required to read and comment on these reports prior to Board submission, paying special attention to all use of force and personnel complaints. There was one of each type during the reporting period.

The use of force report was generated by Officer Ward after an incident involving a car break-in in one of the parking garages. The suspect was apprehended without serious injury to either himself, or Officer Ward and the incident was captured on Officer Ward's body camera. The Chief also informed the CPSC of a personnel complaint lodged against a CPSO dispatcher.

CPSC members asked the Chief clarifying questions regarding both incidents. After robust discussion, the Chair asked for a motion from the committee acknowledging review of the two reports and any concerns they might have with elements of either report. The CPSC expressed no concerns with the reports and the motion passed unanimously.

Topic: CPSC planning

Discussion: The Chair initiated a planning discussion for the coming year. The committee listed some of the topics they were interested in acting upon during the 2016-17 academic year. These topics included:

- Surveying students, faculty, staff and possibly university district neighbors to identify safety issues of concern to the campus community.
- Reviewing results of the Title IX report, the Campus Climate survey, and the American Health Association's recent survey. These three sources all ask campus safety questions and the Committee is interested in "mining" these reports for data that will help inform CPSC planning for the coming year.
- Drug use on campus.
- Sexual Assault training on campus.
- Assessing the transition to a sworn and armed police force.
- Analysis of policy changes that led to the transition.
- Producing an audit of which centers and departments could provide support services to CPSO.
- Developing a suite of measures for assessing CPSO that are more qualitative, and do *not* use crime statistics.
- Producing listening sessions/town halls/surveys to hear from the PSU community on campus safety issues.
- Developing internal metrics that express the quality of CPSO service interactions. Taking into consideration what steps can be taken to help ensure consistently positive interactions while including the perspectives of officers and survivor advocates.
- Determine what steps the Committee can take to improve real and perceived safety issues on campus.

During this discussion, VP Reynolds joined the meeting and asked the committee to prepare a recommendation for whether or not PSU should put locks on its classroom doors. This issue came up in the context of recent active shooter incidents on other campuses and will be added to CPSC's project list for 2016-17.

Research Question: What campus safety concerns are surfaced by the recent Title IX report, the Campus Climate survey, and the American Health Association's survey?

Action: Staff to review findings from the three documents and summarize any campus safety considerations that may impact the work of the CPSC.

Topic: Summer

Discussion: The CPSC will not meet during the summer. However, members of the committee who are on campus are encouraged to do "walk/ride alongs" with CPSO officers during this time. Officer Halliburton is the point of contact for arranging these learning experiences.

Topic: CPSC recruitment

Discussion: Student members Michelle Holiday and Marcus Sis are (congratulations!) graduating. Their leaving creates a critical shortage of student members on the CPSC.

Action: The Committee will be coordinating a recruitment drive when students return in the fall. They are particularly interested in having multiple student perspectives represented on the committee, especially the perspectives of graduate and undergraduate students, as well as students living on campus.
