Duties and Responsibilities

- Represent CREC at recruitment and outreach events across campus, including but not limited to: new student/transfer orientations, admitted student receptions, Viking Day events, student engagement fairs, and departmental events
- Assist with outreach efforts for CREC as needed
- Table across campus and at events
- Take students on tours of the Rec Center facility
- Give presentations and info sessions at events
- Deliver CREC marketing materials to various departments across campus
- Assist in CREC marketing social media efforts and campaigns
- Assist the Marketing & Outreach leadership team with marketing related activities as needed
- Attend required outreach team meetings
- Maintain and update posters and signage within the Rec Center facility, and distribute marketing materials across campus.
- Organize, label, and distribute swag items.
- Manage and update your Google calendar for work availability and scheduling
- Collaborate with departments across campus to further CREC's mission, vision, and values.

Expectations

- To maintain any valid certifications that is required of your position.
- Ability to establish and maintain an effective working relationship with other team members and supervisors
- Ability to interact with vendors, students, and the public to provide information in a polite and efficient manner both in person and on the phone
- Ability to effectively communicate through email, in person, and with groups of people effectively and in a professional manner
- Maintain a 24 hour email response time during all business days
- Be available for mandatory team training and meetings

Typical Working Hours

 Climbing Center Instructors are expected to work a minimum of 8 hours per week. Shifts are typically between 4-8 pm Monday-Friday and Saturdays 10am-2pm. Setting shifts take place one day a week with a staff member setting every other week for 4 hours.

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- Some additional evenings and weekends are required for special events.
- Additional hours will be required for special events including the Bouldering Competition in early April and the annual maintenance period in late August.

Working Conditions

- Type of work – Aspects of this work are physically demanding and require a good baseline of physical fitness relative to technical rock climbing
- Uniform staff shirt, nametag, pants, skirt, or shorts (must be of appropriate length)
- Location of work Academic and Student Recreation Center Climbing Wall, Outdoor Program Office

Minimum Qualifications

- Maintain minimum enrollment (6 credits for undergraduates, 5 credits for graduates) for three out of four terms in the year
- Minimum 2.0 grade point average (undergrad) and 3.0 (graduate) and maintain good academic standing throughout employment
- Commitment to Campus Rec's mission, vision, values, and dignity statements
- Positive attitude
- Ability to respond to emergency situations
- Good communication skills
- Ability to work with people
- Functions and communicates effectively and respectfully within the context of varying beliefs, behaviors, orientations, identities and cultural backgrounds
- American Red Cross First Aid/CPR/AED certification within 30 days of hire for any employee who works within the Rec Center gated entrance and/or supervises activity areas or excursions.
- Passion for climbing, with a heavy intensity of climbing in the last 6 months.
- Passion for instruction and an interest in acquiring the technical skills related to indoor climbing.
- American Red Cross
- Must successfully complete a background check

Preferred Qualifications

- Ability to teach technical aspects of climbing in a polished and professional manner including: belaying, basic climbing, knots, and climbing movement.
- Experience working with diverse populations.
- Strong interpersonal and communication skills.
- Demonstrated history of appropriate customer service skills.
- Experience with route setting.
- PCIA or AMGA certification.

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Special Notes

- The position begins on August 30, 2021 and employees must be available for the full week (8/30 9/3) for Climbing Center Maintenance and resetting. In addition, staff training will occur September 13 September 15.
- The Climbing Center prefers to hire students who have at least one full year left at PSU.
