FOREWORD

The Fall Term Fact Book is published annually by the Office of Institutional Research and Planning at Portland State University. The format of the Fact Book is an extension of the more extensively historical Statistical Portrait, which is produced at the end of each academic year. The purpose of the Fact Book is to present useful and accurate information in a quantitative report.

The Student Section of the Fact Book is divided into three subsections: Inload Enrollment, Continuing Education & Self-Support Programs, and Total Enrollment. The inload Enrollment subsection includes regular courses. The Continuing Education & Self-Support Programs subsection includes courses offered through Continuing Education & Self-Support Programs. The Total Enrollment subsection equals the grand total of Inload Enrollment and Continuing Education & Self-Support Programs.

2012 fall term headcount enrollment was 28,731 for all campuses. 80.6% were undergraduates and 19.4% were graduate students. There were 15,485 females (53.9%) and 13,246 males (46.1%) enrolled in the fall term. 60% of students were full-time and 40% were part-time. The average carrying load was 10.1 credits.

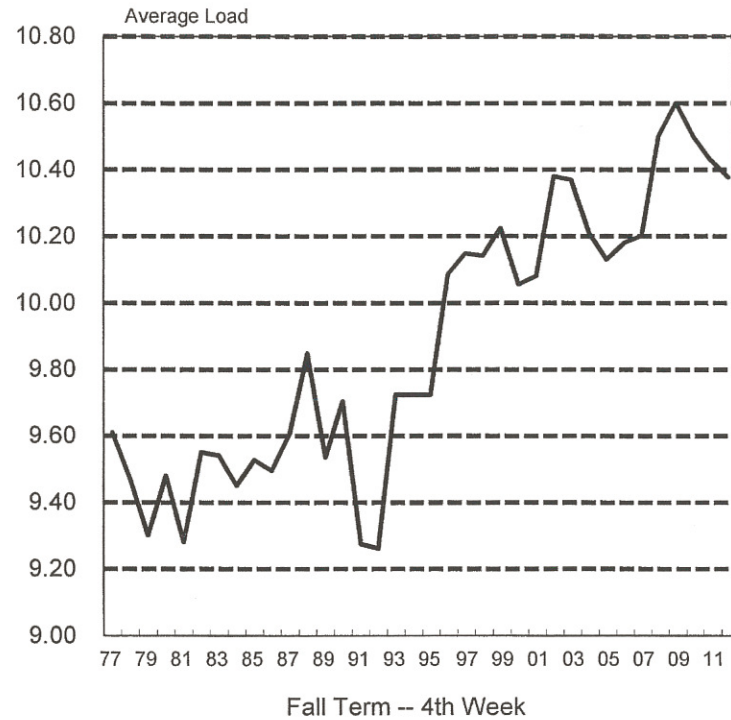

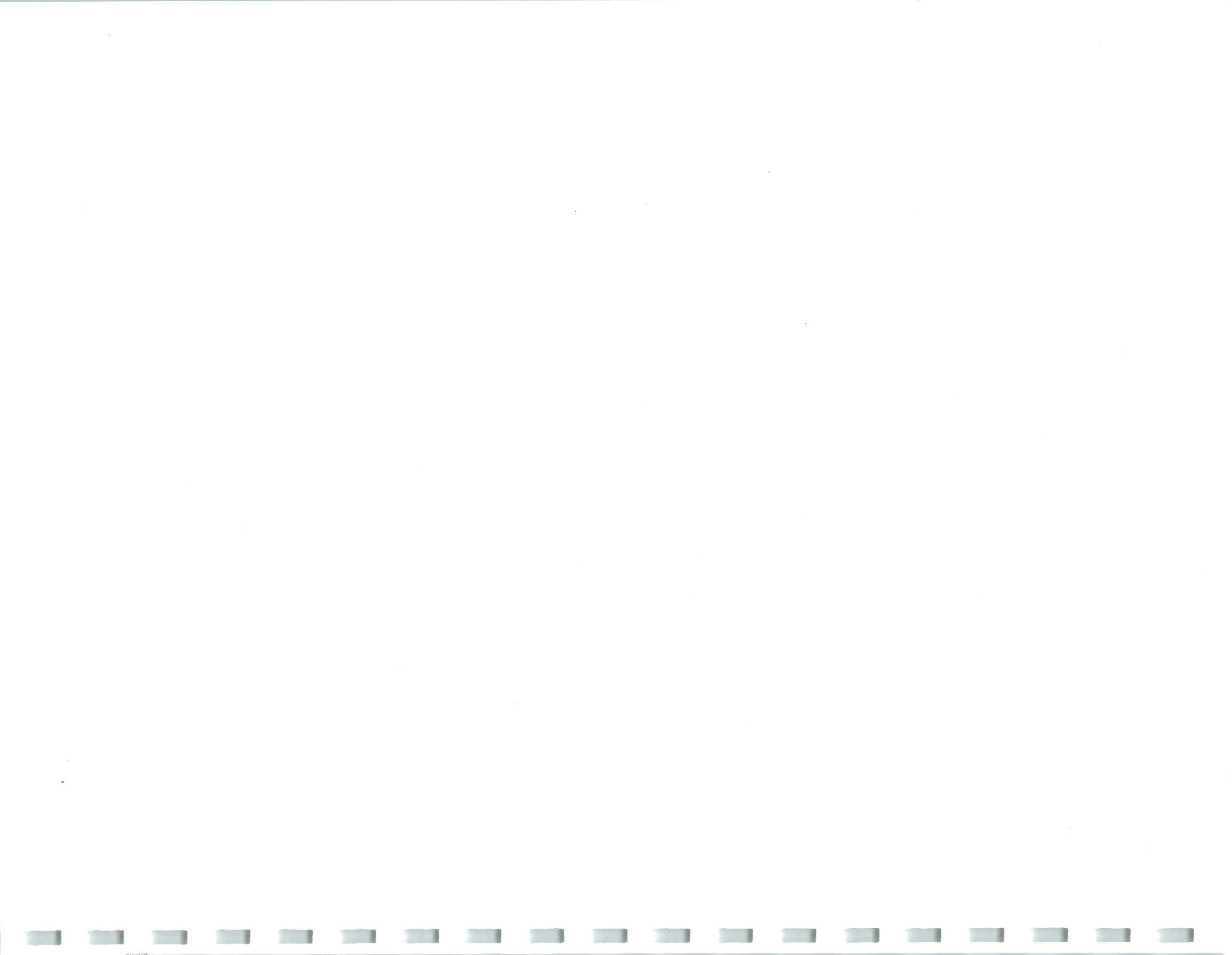

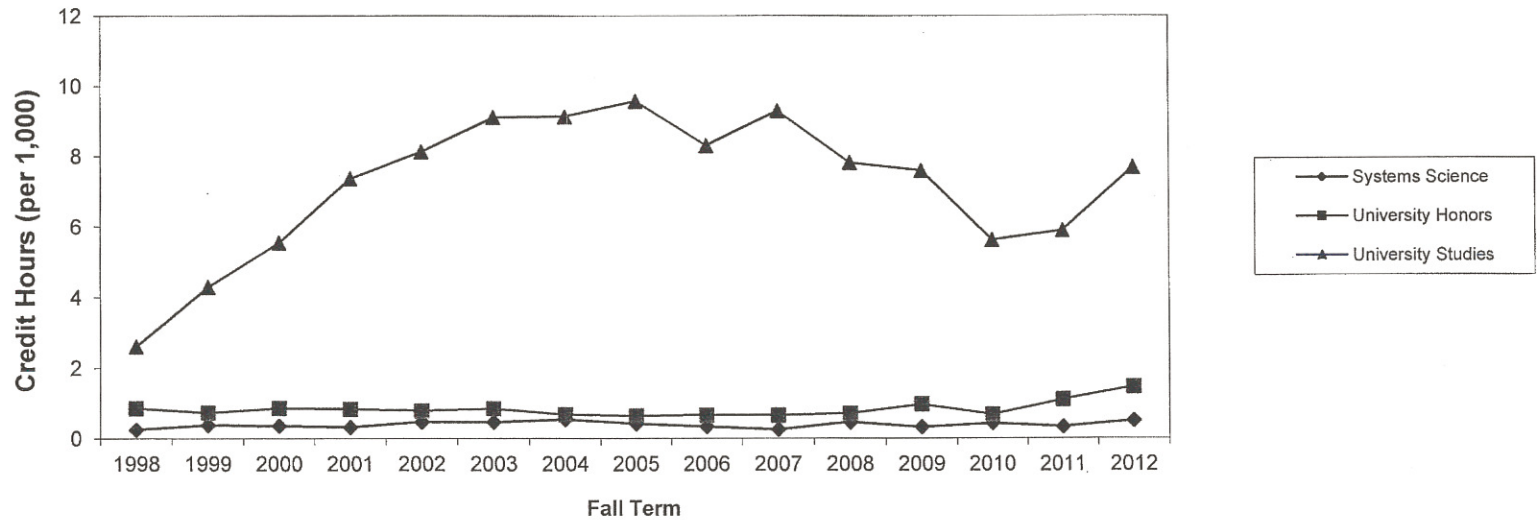

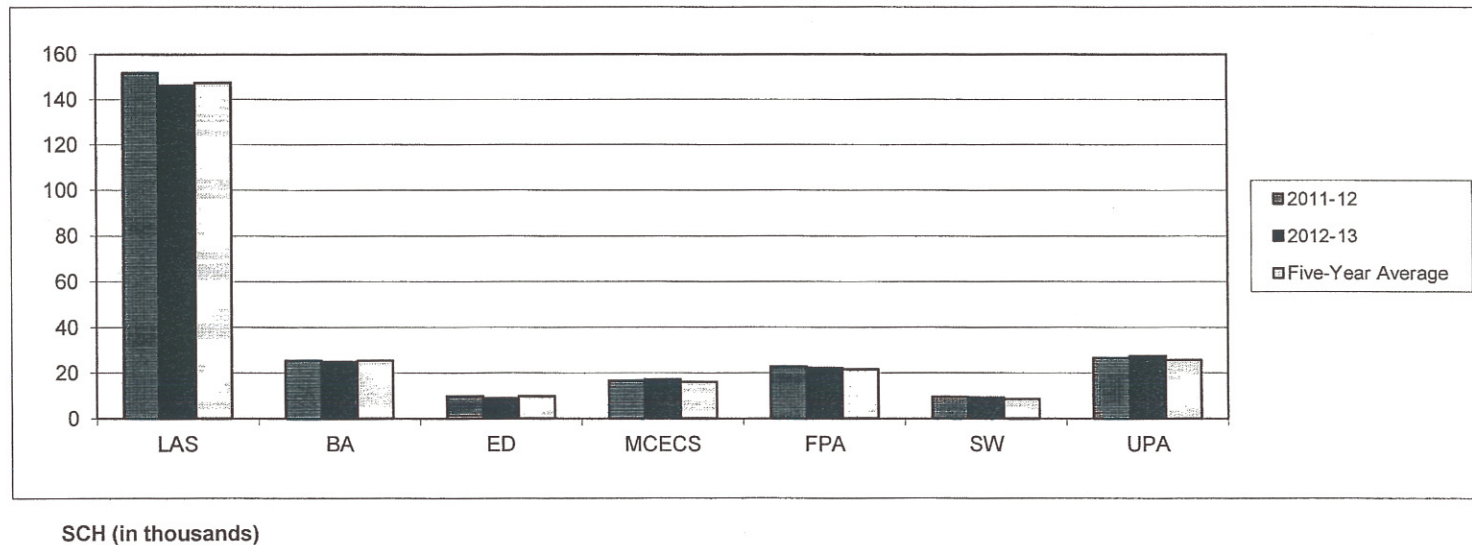

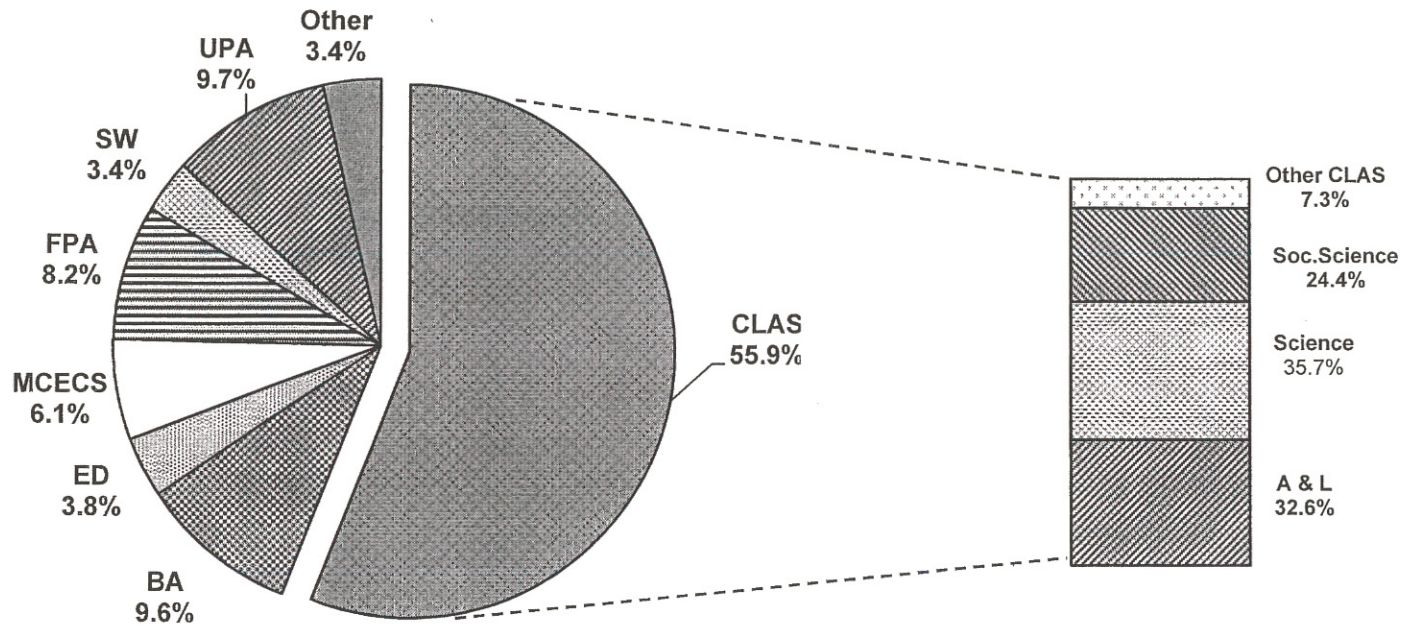

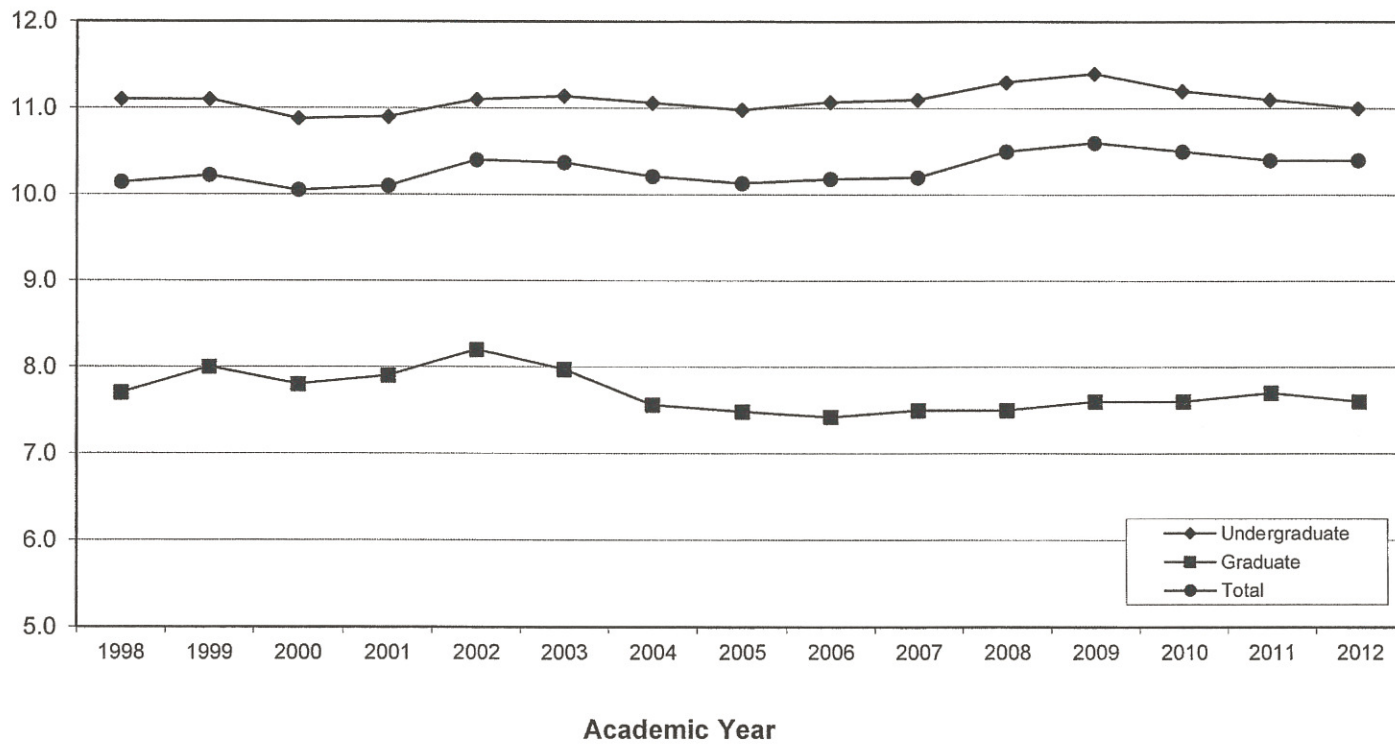

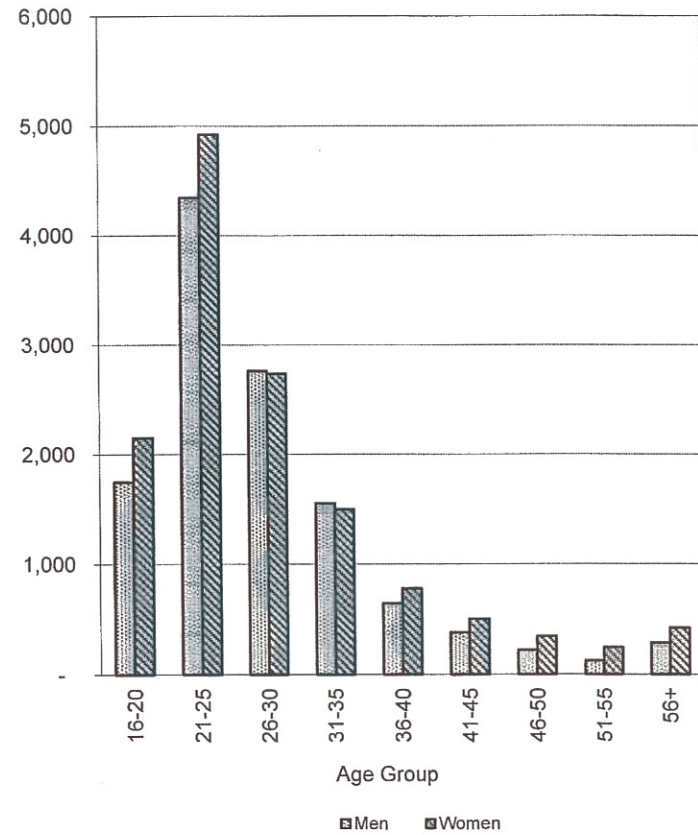

Inload Enrollment

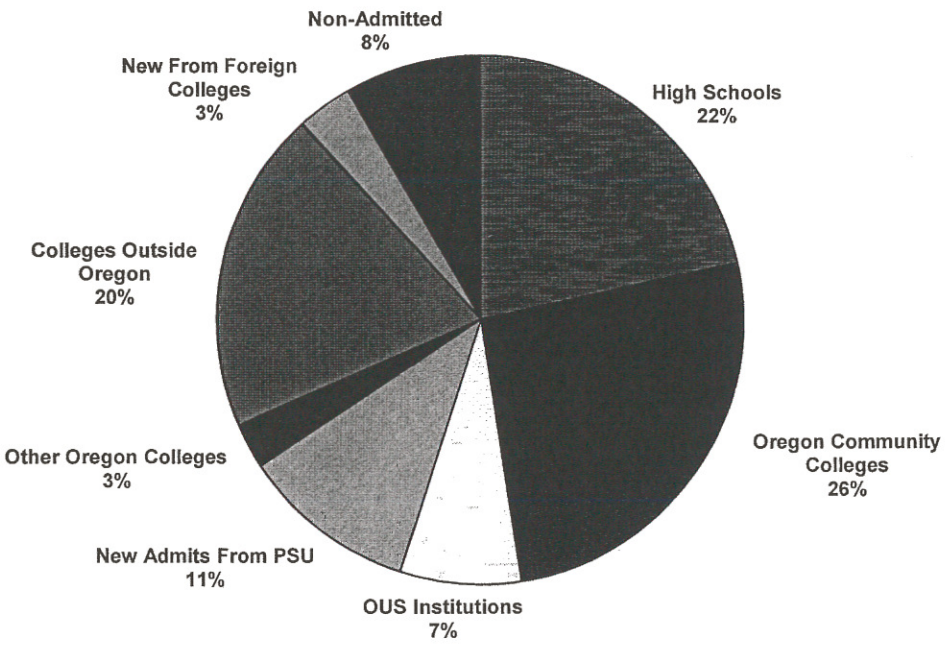


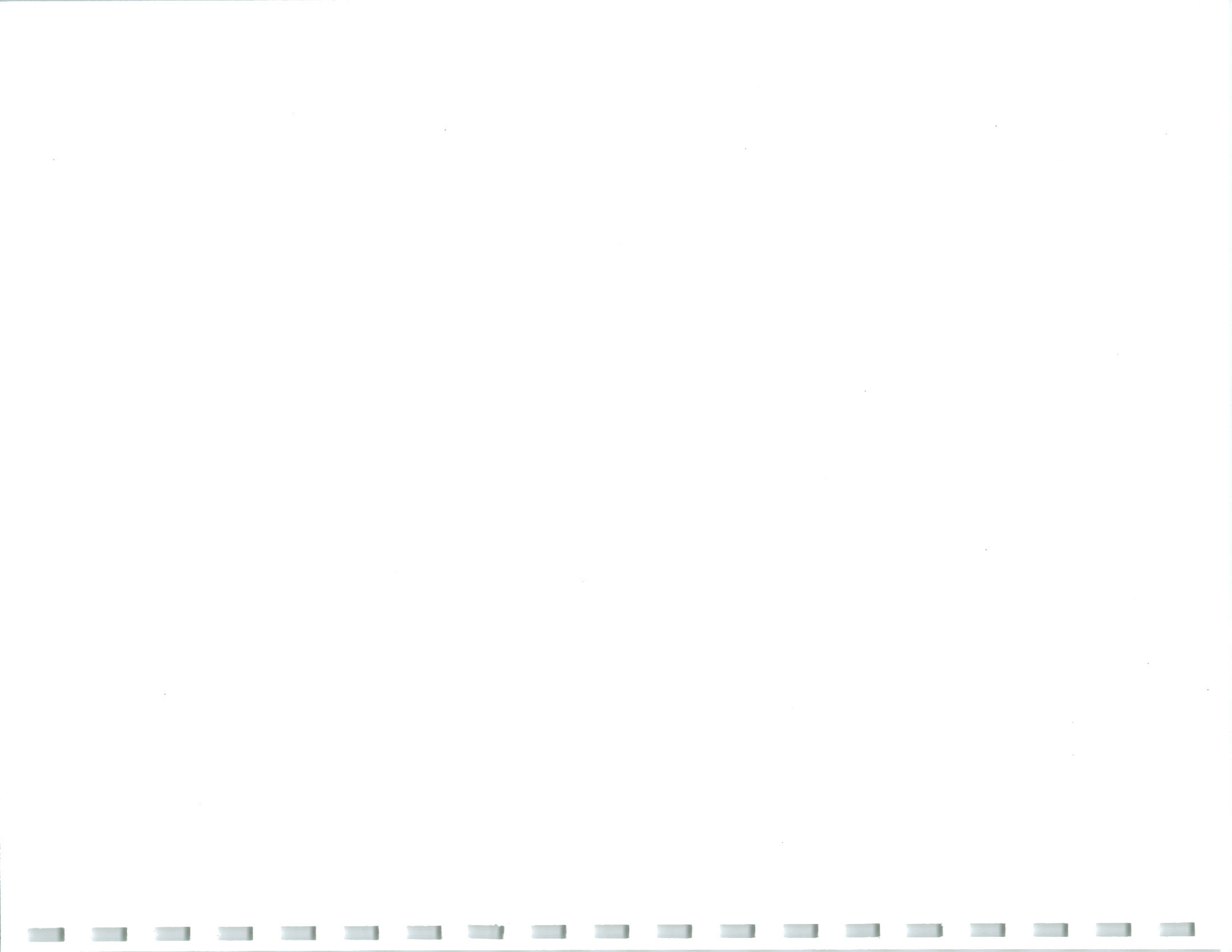

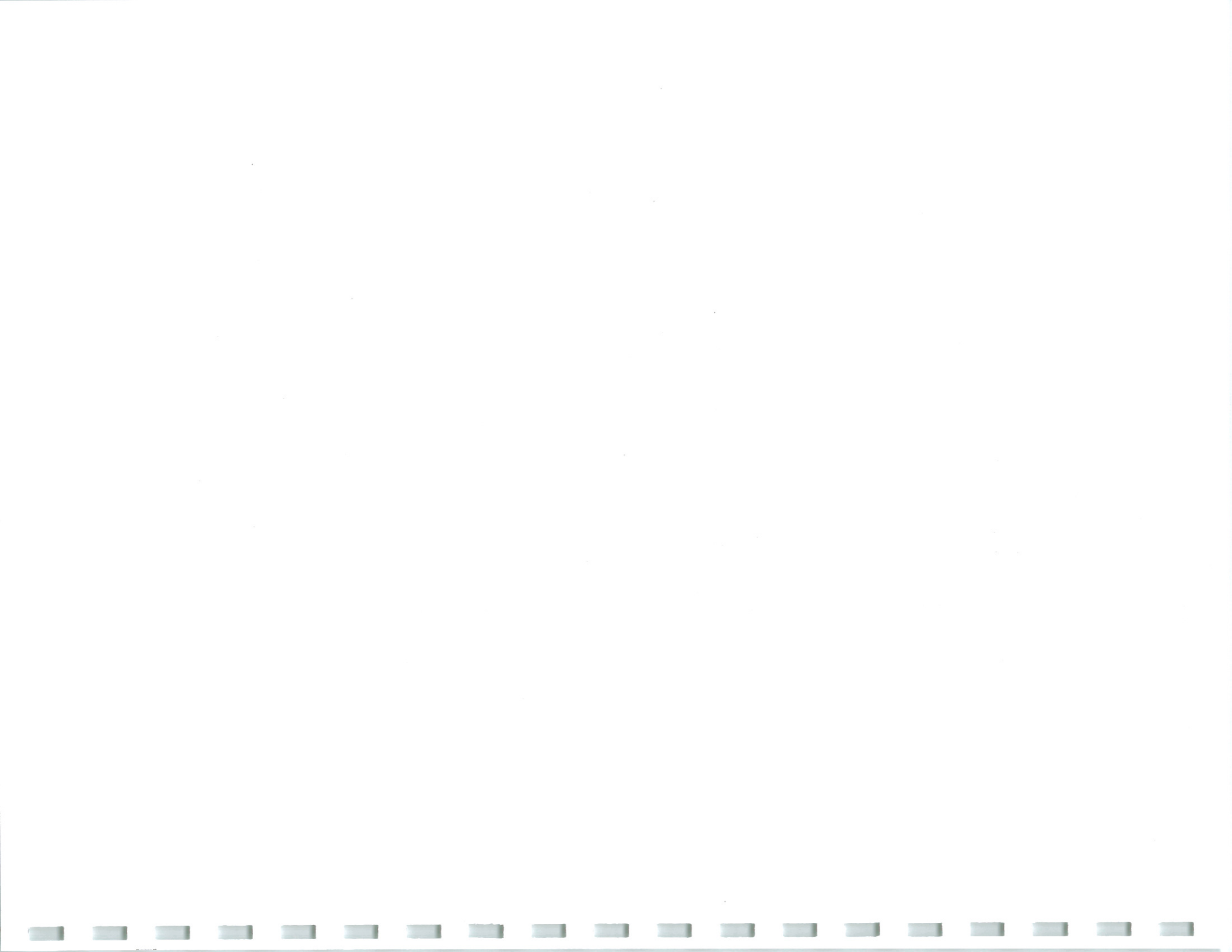

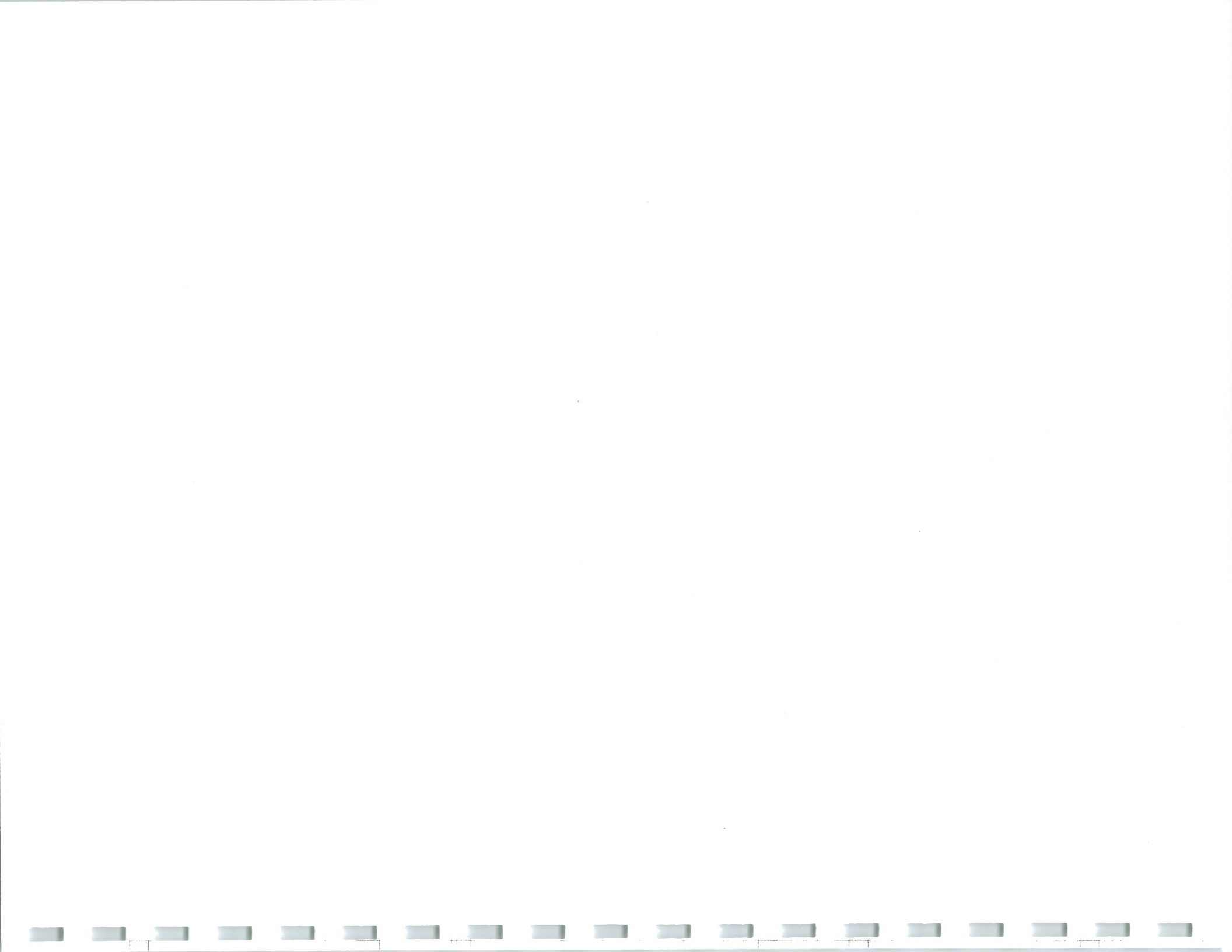
