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# *FOREWORD*

## FOREWORD

The Fall Term Fact Book is published annually by the Office of Institutional Research and Planning at Portland State University. The format of the Fact Book is an extension of the more extensively historical Statistical Portrait which is produced at the end of each academic year. The purpose of the Fact Book is to present useful and accurate information in a quantitative report.

2013 Fall Term headcount enrollment was 28,766 for all campuses. 81% were undergraduates and 19% were graduate students. There were 15,352 females (53.4%) and 13,414 males (46.6%) enrolled in the Fall Term. 60.2% of students were full-time and 39.8% were part-time. The average carrying load was 10.1 credits.

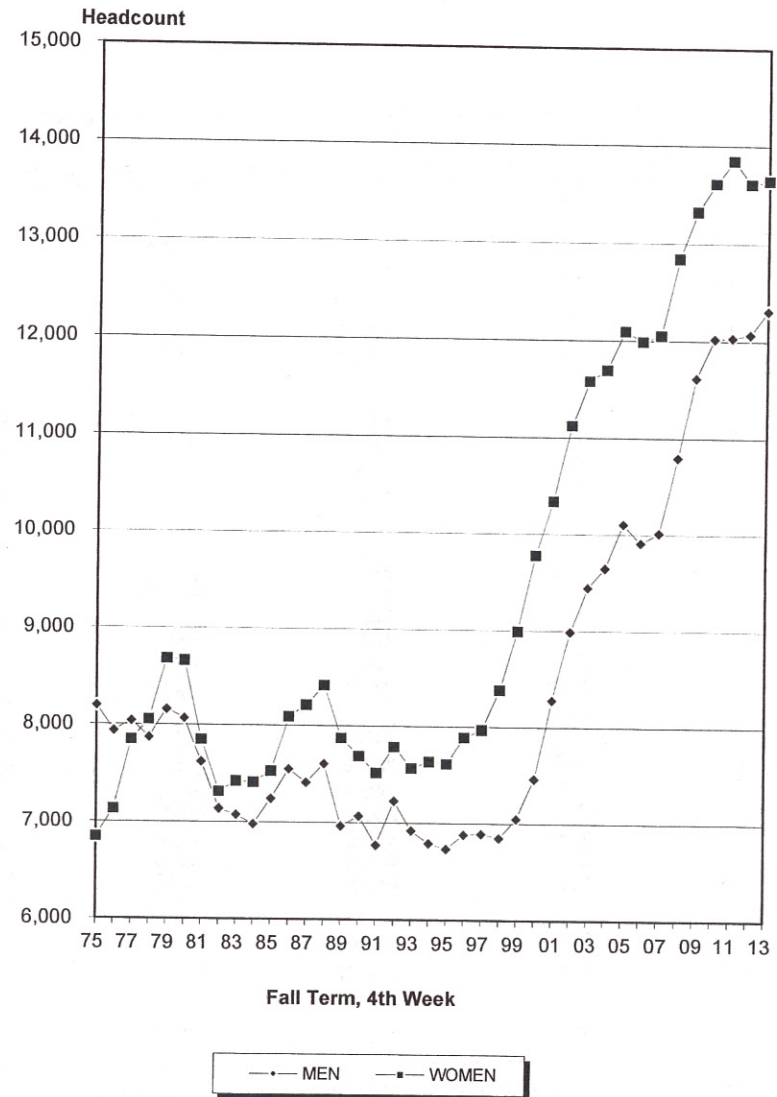

**Total Enrollment**



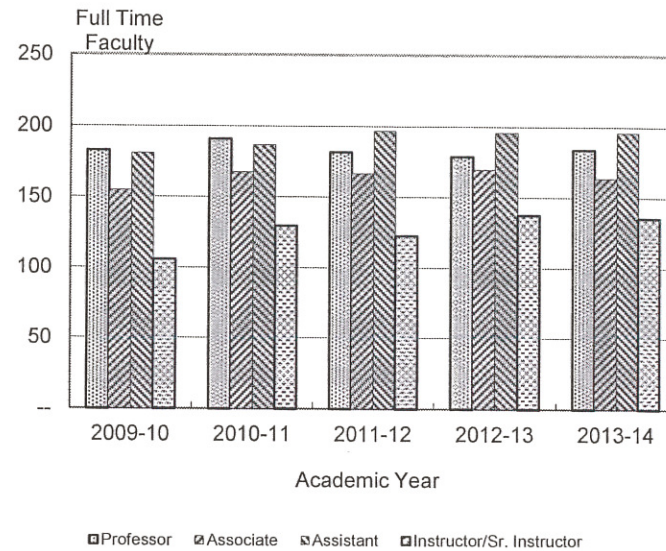
