FOREWORD

The *Fall Term Fact Book* is published annually by the Office of Institutional Research and Planning at Portland State University. The format of the Fact Book is an extension of the more extensively historical *Statistical Portrait* which is produced at the end of each academic year. The purpose of the Fact Book is to present useful and accurate information in a quantitative report.

2014 Fall Term headcount enrollment was 28,241 for all campuses. 80% were undergraduates and 20% were graduate students. There were 15,121 females (53.5%) and 13,120 males (46.5%) enrolled in the Fall Term. 61.4% of students were full-time and 38.6% were part-time. The average carrying load was 10.3 credits.

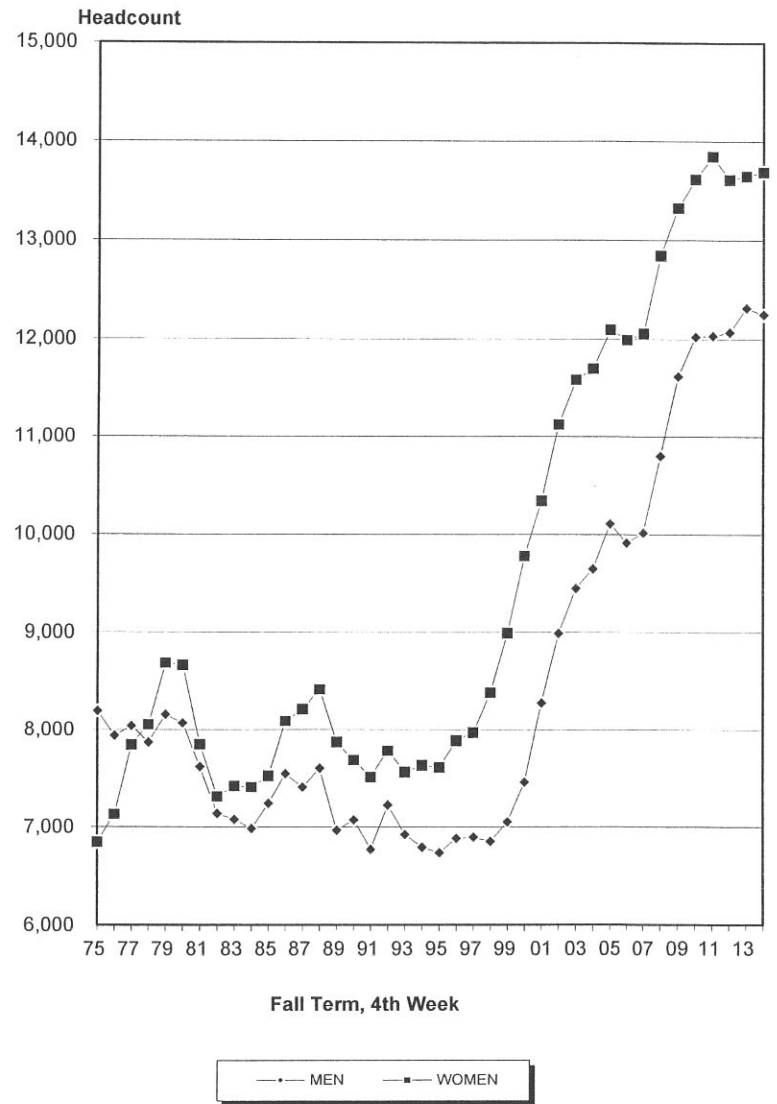

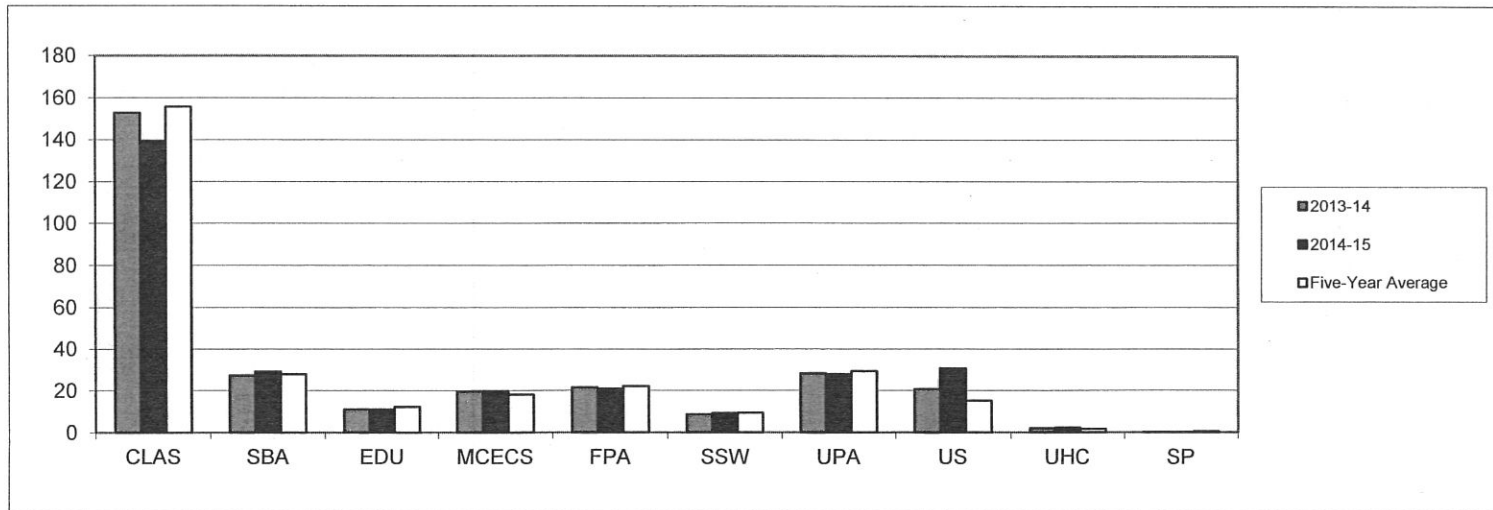

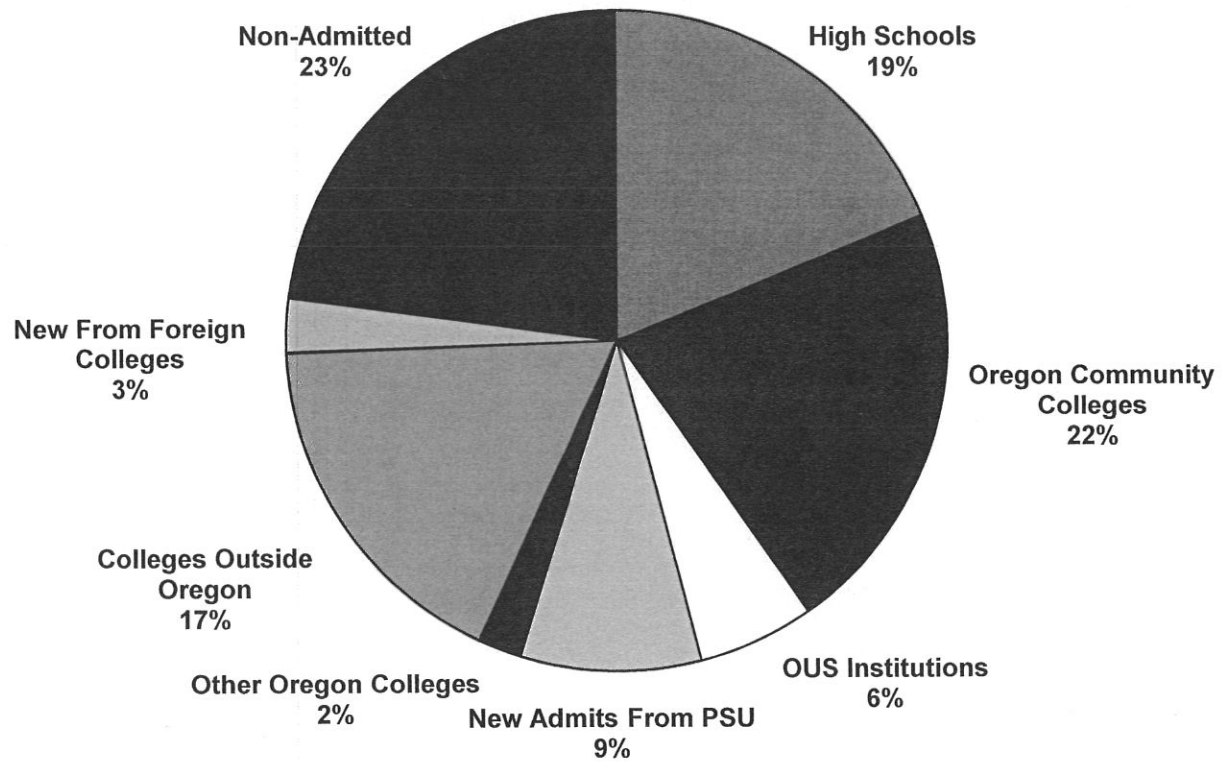

Total Enrollment

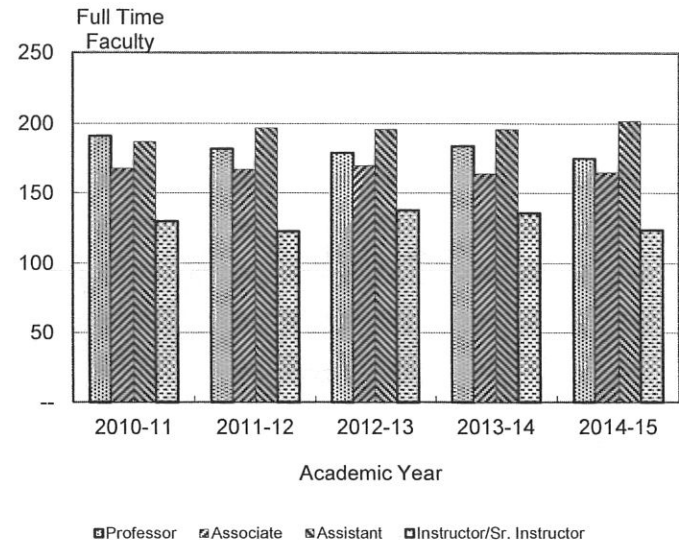
