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GENERAL

BACKGROUND

History/Location: Portland State University is Oregon's urban public university. Founded in 1946 as Vanport Extension Center of the Oregon State System of Higher Education, it became Portland State College, a separate degree-granting institution, in 1955, and was re-named Portland State University in 1969. The Carnegie Foundation currently classifies Portland State University as a Doctoral/Research University-Intensive. The Portland metropolitan area has a population of approximately 2.2 million.

Academic Schools and Colleges, Programs and Degrees: The University comprises the Colleges of Liberal Arts and Sciences, Urban and Public Affairs, and Engineering and Computer Science; Schools of Business Administration, Fine and Performing Arts, the Graduate School of Education, the School of Social Work, and Extended Studies. During the 2011-2012 academic year 4,320 bachelor's degrees, 1,654 master's degrees, and 65 doctoral degrees were awarded. The University offers bachelor's degrees in 81 fields, certificate programs in 19 areas at the undergraduate level and 45 at the graduate level, master's degrees in 91 programs, and doctoral degrees in 18 programs. In 2011-2012 doctoral degrees were awarded in Computer Science, Educational Leadership, Civil and Environmental Engineering, Electrical and Computer Engineering, Environmental Sciences and Resources, Mathematical Sciences, Mathematics Education, Chemistry, Social Work & Social Research, Public Administration and Policy, Systems Science, and Urban Studies.

Faculty: In 2011-2012 there were 862 budgeted instructional faculty FTE positions and 219 FTE Graduate Assistants. The student/faculty ratio was 17.3. More than 67% of full-time instructional faculties were tenured. Average 2011-2012 AAUP full-time instructional faculty salaries were \$94,217 for full professors and \$69,565 for all ranks (after 12-month salaries were converted to nine-month equivalents).

Enrollment: Fall 2011 headcount enrollment excluding extension students was 25,883 (18,764 FTE) including 20,835 undergraduate students (15,400 FTE), and 5,048 graduate students (3,364 FTE). Sixty-six percent (13,707) of undergraduate students and 50% percent (2,529) of graduate students were enrolled full time. 52% of undergraduate students and 59% of graduate students were female. Twenty-one percent of undergraduate students and 14% of graduate students were members of protected minority groups. Overall, 19.8% of PSU students who were citizens or permanent residents of the US were members of protected minority groups (7.4% were Asian, 3.1% African-American, 7.2% Hispanic, 1.5% Native American, and 0.6% Pacific Islander). An additional 7% of the student bodies were international students, representing 99 nations. In addition to the students enumerated above, nearly 20,000 individuals each year enrolled in credit-bearing courses offered through PSU's School of Extended Studies. Approximately 7.9% of PSU students lived in university-owned campus housing.

Costs: Annual tuition for full-time (12 credit hours) undergraduate students who were Oregon residents was \$6,531 in 2011-2012; non-resident full-time (12 credit hours) undergraduate tuition was \$18,708. Tuition for Oregon resident full-time (9 credit hours) graduate students was \$10,626; for full-time (9 credit hours) non-resident graduate students, tuition was \$15,702

Institutional Affiliations: PSU is accredited by the Northwest Association of Schools and Colleges. It is a member of the National Association of State Universities and Land Grant Colleges (NASULGC), the American Association of State Colleges and Universities (AASCU), the Association of American Colleges and Universities (AACU) and the Association of Urban Universities. In athletics, PSU is a Division I member of the Big Sky Conference.



2002-03 to 2011-12



1946-47 to 2011-12


