2004-05 to 2013-14

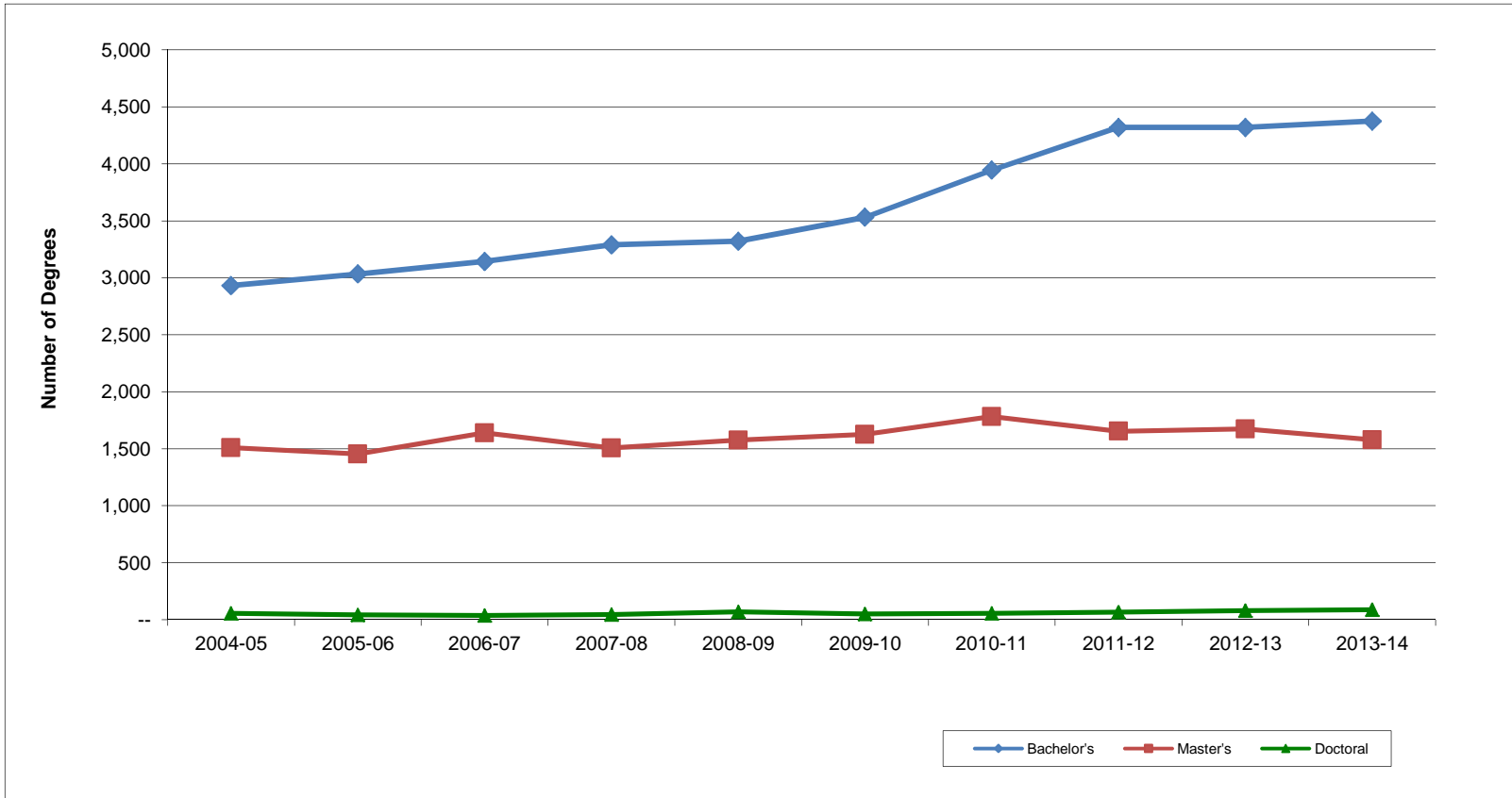
