^{**}Certificate Note: Total minimum of 18 credits including 11 core credits, 6-8 gerontology elective credits (e.g., any aging-specific or has "aging" in course title), and a 3-credit internship at an aging services program 8 hours per week for 10 weeks <u>OR</u> be concurrent with an aging-relevant dissertation/research practicum for 1-credit research unit with IOA in addition to submitting a reflective paper. If the student's dissertation topic were not relevant to gerontology, then they would have to do the internship (AGE 504) or an independent research paper (AGE 501).
