Most research electives are offered with 4 credits, however, some are offered with 3 or 5 credits. Using **SW 603** credits, Students are strongly encouraged to enroll Research in Progress (RIP) course(s) in the process of preparing their dissertation.

****Certificate Note:** Total minimum of 18 credits including 11 core credits, 6-8 gerontology elective credits (e.g., any aging-specific or has “aging” in course title), and a 3-credit internship at an aging services program 8 hours per week for 10 weeks **OR** be concurrent with an aging-relevant dissertation/research practicum for 1-credit with IOA in addition to submitting a reflective paper. If the student’s dissertation topic were not relevant to gerontology, then they would have to do the internship (PHE 504) or an independent research paper (PHE 501).
