Documentation is not required to prove expenses, and individual awards will be capped at \$1000 per student.

Awarding Process

Portland State University will review applications as they are submitted and will notify students on a rolling basis of their eligibility and award amounts. The maximum award is up to \$1000. We will award funds based on students' stated expenses. Funding from the COVID-19 Emergency Fund will not impact a student's financial aid package. Grant funds will be disbursed directly to student accounts. Disbursements of funds will not be applied to an outstanding balance on the student account without the student's permission.
