



Memorandum of Understanding

Between the Child, Youth, and Family Studies Program at Portland State University

And

the Early Childhood Education Program at Clackamas Community College

Purpose

Portland State University agrees to accept credits for students transferring from Clackamas Community College to PSU, as outlined in Exhibit A- Transfer Guide. In the event of a discrepancy between Exhibit A and this Agreement, the language of the Agreement shall take precedence.

Duration

This agreement will begin on January 3, 2022 and last until August 31, 2028, at which time it will be reviewed for renewal.

Nothing in this agreement creates any legally binding obligation on either party. This agreement cannot be enforced by any court or tribunal. Nothing in this agreement is to be construed to give rise to any claim, for damages or otherwise, against any party.
