

## TRIO Educational Talent Search Objectives & Outcomes

Educational Talent Search has been hosted by Portland State University since 1967. ETS serves 685 low-income/first-generation students in four high schools and four middle schools in Portland. The **program mission** is to identify, motivate, and assist students in their educational transition into college. We encourage students to stay in school and graduate, and to enroll in a community college, a four-year college or university, or a vocational/technical college. ETS services are aimed at creating positive opportunities for youth in the academic, social and cultural arenas in order to enhance a sense of belonging, usefulness, competitiveness and competence.

Middle school services include college orientation activities, technology skill-building, college & career field trips, and academic workshops designed to prepare students for post-secondary education. High school services include college orientation activities, assistance with admissions and financial aid forms, college visitations, and career and academic workshops designed to prepare students for post-secondary education. In the last 20 years, 85% of our graduating seniors have enrolled in college.

## Primary Objectives for Talent Search – 2019 Achievements

**OUTCOME OBJECTIVE I**: **95%** of non-senior participants served each project year will complete the current academic year and continue in school for the next academic year, at the next grade level **(506/512 = 99%)** 

**OUTCOME OBJECTIVE II**: **80%** of seniors served during the project year will graduate with a regular secondary school diploma within the standard number of years. **(173/173 = 100%)** 

**OBJECTIVE III**: **65%** of seniors served during the project year will complete a rigorous secondary school program of study and will graduate with a regular secondary school diploma within the standard number of years. **(156/173 = 90%)** 

**OBJECTIVE IV: 75%** of participants, who have graduated with a regular secondary school diploma, during the project year, will enroll in an institution of higher education by the fall or winter term immediately following high school graduation. **(141/173 = 82%)** 

**OUTCOME OBJECTIVE V**: **30%** of participants served during the project year who enrolled in an institution of higher education by the fall term immediately following high school graduation will complete a program of postsecondary education within six years. **(92/159 = 58%)**
