## SELF-GUIDED CAMPUS TOUR

- **Urban Plaza:** A great place to unwind, get some lunch, and people-watch as students make their way to and from class. You'll find bus, light rail and streetcar stations here.
- 2 University Welcome Center: The UWC welcomes prospective students and the community to Portland State and doubles as the Office of Admissions. Our student representatives can give you directions and answer any questions about PSU.
- 3 Vanport Building: Our newest building houses the City of Portland's Bureau of Planning and Sustainability, PCC's Dental Services Programs, PSU's College of Education, and the PSU/OHSU School of Public Health.
- 4 Campus Rec: Students and our community can exercise at our gym, featuring a running track, a weight training facility, multi-purpose fitness suites, lap pool, bouldering wall, and space for student clubs and intramural sports.
- 5 Karl Miller Center: Completed in Fall 2017, this building houses the School of Business and the Office of International Affairs. The lofty, open design promotes natural light and a restaurant space is on the ground level.
- 6 Lincoln Hall: Lincoln Hall was the first building that PSU occupied when it moved here in 1952. The College of the Arts is located in Lincoln Hall and houses the schools of Music, Theater and Film.
- 7 Smith Memorial Student Union: Smith is a hub of activities and services for students, including restaurants, art galleries, a bowling alley, The Vanguard (PSU's student newspaper), four of our cultural resource centers, an intimate concert venue, and a quiet study area.
- 8 Fariborz Maseeh Hall: FMH houses student services like ID distribution, registration, student financial services, academic advising and career services. Classrooms and laboratories serve numerous arts and sciences programs, and the building is home to the Jordan Schnitzer Museum of Art, PSU's first on-campus art museum open to the public.
- 9 <u>Park Blocks</u>: A unique meeting ground for students, an outdoor study area, and a space for everything from arts events to the farmer's market.
  - **Simon Benson House:** Home of the PSU Alumni Association. With ornate architecture and vintage charm, Simon Benson House is one of the highlights of the campus Park Blocks.

- Branford P. Millar Library: With multiple computer labs, thousands of books, research resources, quiet group study rooms, presentation rooms, a tutoring center, laptop and calculator rental, and a cafe, the library has everything students need to hit the books and study effectively.
- 12 <u>Viking Pavilion</u>: This multi-purpose arena hosts our men's basketball, women's basketball, and volleyball teams and includes 15,000 square feet for studying, tutoring and advising. The façade that faces the Park Blocks resembles a viking ship, an homage to our mascot Victor E. Viking.
- 13 <u>Shattuck Hall</u>: One of oldest and most distinct buildings on campus, here you'll find our School of Architecture.
- 14 Native American Student & Community Center: The Center welcomes the Native Community to PSU's campus, providing opportunities for shared learning and understanding. An aerial view of the NASCC reveals a salmon-shaped design of the building.
- 15 Broadway Residence Hall: A residence hall for freshmen, the building consists of 382 furnished studio apartments. There are classrooms and a computer laboratory located on the second floor and retail space dominates the ground floor.
- 16 <u>Victor's Dining Hall</u>: A unique, all-you-care-to-eat style dining experience in an urban restaurant, featuring a rotating menu as well as nightly dinner specials.
- 17 Engineering Building: A LEED-NC Gold certified building completed in 2006, here you'll find the Maseeh College of Engineering and Computer Science,.
- 18 <u>Food Carts</u>: Offering everything from international fare to chips and a sandwich, this a great place to stop off for a snack or lunch.
- 19 Robertson Life Sciences Building: A unique space where biology and chemistry students can interact with professionals and experience real-world research. This building is a collaborative educational effort between Oregon Health and Science University, Portland State University and Oregon State University.
- 20 <u>Tilikum Crossing</u>: The only bridge in the country dedicated to light rail, buses, bicycles and pedestrians—without automobile traffic.
