## **Intercultural Competence for the Workplace Certificate:**

- Thorne + Greco working this summer to create Modeled off of South Dakota State University's certificate
- Will include one year of language class
- Also include an experiential learning course that Roulon is designing (Roulon/Godfrey/Zagarella will teach)
- Students will choose an intercultural communication or intentional communication class plus some kind of global course in their field

## Dolidon Popup course follow up

- Had 18 students, very positive feedback
- Students really want to take other popups
- Dolidon had diverse students, mostly FR/WLL students
- Excited about the format
- Great environment to connect with existing students
- If you don't want to create a popup you should be an advocate

## **CLAS Dean Team Budget Road Show**, Todd, DyLys, Matt

- We don't have a budget yet, the legislature hasn't decided on funding package, haven't gotten to \$120 million to keep us whole, we haven't set tuition yet
- Top 5% in nation in producing language degrees- relayed to provost
- We've made cuts for the last 5 years, we have never gotten enough state support
- HECC receives funding and distributes it, arguing they need more money to increase graduation rates, but aren't getting more money
- Enrollment continues to decline
- WLL is a profitable department
- We've been asked by OAA to take a 4% cut- about 3 million dollars

- Paused lines don't exist
- Math had 8 tenure lined faculty staff leave needed to backfill these positions, adjuncts, fixed term, and 2 tenure track
- Summer savings: history cut one class (less costs) but increased SCH
- We get funded based on graduated students, not on SCH
- CLAS has no reserve- there is NO savings account, no funds for requests, etc.
- We are largest employers of GTAs in the university, forced to cut 40 GTAs college-wide (about 1 million dollars)
  - Now co-founding 10 GTA positions with university studies
  - Fund 10 GTA remissions for academic year and work with RGS on an additional 5 remissions
  - Brought equity lens to looking at GTA pay, increase base stipends by 42% above contract minimums (from \$24,000 to \$34,000) for only those units below \$34,000
- Fewer employees but the ones we have are paid more
- Worked with chairs to reduce 3% (adjuncts savings, summer savings, Deans office cuts)
- Provost is VERY focused on improving graduation rates- if we can't recruit more students,
   we can increase retention

#### **FACULTY QUESTIONS**

- Ask provost for other departmental budgets- especially for non-revenue generating departments
- Balance of teaching and research- how will P&T guidelines be affected? Are they adapting?
   CLAS as a unique 2-level review process, DeLys says we have the best committee, they really value letters written by the Chair
- The search for a new CLAS dean began this week
- Not replacing tenure track faculty could be catastrophic, also have an exhaustion of leadership, what is the point of putting more into the university for people leaving soon?
- Money allocation by the state to education isn't enough!
